In The Forest Of Pennsylvania Between Newton, PA & Trenton, NJ Alongside The Delaware River For George Washington
As The Commander Of The Colonial Army
On The Morning Of December 4th, 1776

- 1) Lack Of Winter Clothing & Shelter
- 2) Lack Of Winter Boots Or Even Shoes & Socks
- 3) Lack Of Food & Scared Citizens Who Were Afraid To Help
 - 4) Lack Of Ammunition & A Way To Keep It Dry
 - 5) A Broke Government Who Could Not Pay The Troops
- 6) Enlistments That Ended In 27 Days On December 31, 1776
- 7) Not One Victory Since The War Started Only Defeats & Retreats

George Had Some Positives On His Side

- 1) He Had Great Faith In God

"These are the times that try men's souls! The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of their country; but he that stands it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman. Tyranny, like hell, is not easily conquered; yet we have this consolation with us, that the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph. What we obtain too cheap, we esteem too lightly: it is dearness only that gives everything its value. "Heaven knows how to put a proper price upon its goods; and it would be strange indeed if so celestial an article as Freedom should not be highly rated. Britain, with an army to enforce her tyranny, has declared that she has a right (not only to Tax) but "To Bind us in ALL CASES WHATSOEVER," and if being bound in that manner, is not slavery, then is there not such a thing as slavery upon earth. Even the expression is impious; for so unlimited a power can belong only to God!" "Whether the independence of the continent was declared too soon, or delayed too long, I will not now enter into as an argument; my own simple opinion is, that had it been eight months earlier, it would have been much better. We did not make a proper use of last winter, neither could we, while we were in a dependent state. However, the fault, if it were one, was all our own*; we have none to blame but ourselves. The present winter is worth an age, if rightly employed; but, if lost or neglected, the whole continent will partake of the evil; and there is no punishment that man does not deserve, be he who, or what, or where he will, that may be the means of sacrificing a season so precious and useful. I have as little superstition in me as any man living, but my secret opinion has ever been, and still is, that God Almighty will not give up a people to military destruction, or leave them unsupportedly to perish, who have so earnestly and so repeatedly sought to avoid the calamities of war, by every decent method which wisdom could invent. Neither have I so much of the infidel in me, as to suppose that He has relinquished the government of the world, and given us up to the care of devils; and as I do not, I cannot see on what grounds the king of Britain can look up to heaven for help against us: a common murderer, a highwayman, or a house-breaker, has as good a pretence as he. 'Tis surprising to see how rapidly a panic will sometimes run through a country. All nations and ages have been subject to them!"

"I shall not now attempt to give all the particulars of our retreat to the Delaware; suffice it for the present to say, that both officers and men, though greatly harassed and fatigued, frequently without rest, covering, or provision, the inevitable consequences of a long retreat, bore it with a manly and martial spirit. All their wishes centered in one, which was, that the country would turn out and help them to drive the enemy back!"

Every Valley shall Be Exalted and Every Mountain and Hill Brought Low; the Crooked Places shall be Made Straight and the Rough Places Made Smooth; and the Glory of the Lord Shall Be Revealed, and All Flesh Shall See It Together; For The Mouth Of The Lord Has Spoken!" ... Scarcely Shall They Be Planted, Scarcely Shall They Be Sown, Scarcely Shall Their Stock Take Root in the Earth, When He Will also Blow on Them, and They Will Wither Away, and the Whirlwind Will Take Them Away like Stubble. To Whom Then Will You Liken Me, Or To Whom Shall I Be Equal?" Says The Holy One. "Lift Up Your Eyes On High, and See Who Has Created These Things, Who Brings Out Their Host by Number; He Calls Them All By Name, By the Greatness of His Might and the Strength of His Power; Not One Is Missing. A Good Start

- 1) Everything Started Off Really Good & Undetected By The Enemy
 - 2) Everyone Was Moving From Their Jump Off Points

Especially The Main Attacking Force At McKonkey's Ferry Into Position

- 3) The Encircling Forces Were Also In Position & Ready To Move Out
 - 4) All The Lead Commanders Knew What Was Expected Of Them

Something's Unforeseen

- 1) The Ferry Of The Artillery Took Way Longer Than Expected
- 2) The Weather Although A Hindrance In Slowing The Crossing Of The Delaware River Added To The Cover & Concealment Of The Columns Of Soldiers In New Jersey
 - 3) The Encircling 2 # Forces Unbeknownst To Washington Did Not Follow Up
 - a) In One Case (Cadwalader's Regiment) Never Made The Dangerous Crossing
 - b) The Other (Ewing's Regiment) Went Across The River
 - & Then Lost Their Nerve & Retreated Back Across The River Again


Retreat Across New York

December 24, 1776


