What then? The Assembly (Asian Jews of the Diaspora meeting with the Sanhedrin) must certainly meet, for They will hear that You (Paul) have come. Therefore, do what We tell You: We have Four Men Who have taken a Vow (Nazarite). Take Them and be Purified with Them, and Pay Their Expenses so that They may Shave Their Heads, and that All (Jews: Believers & Unbelievers) may know that those things of which They (All) were informed concerning You (Paul), are nothing, but that You Yourself also Walk Orderly and Keep the Law. But Concerning the Gentiles Who Believe, We have Written and Decided that They Should Observe No Such Thing (Circumcision), except that They should keep Themselves: from Things Offered to Idols, 1 from Blood, ^{2a} from Things Strangled, ^{2b} and from Sexual Immorality". ³ Then Paul took the Men (the Four Men Who took the Vow), and the next day, having been Purified with Them, entered the Temple to Announce the Expiration of the Days of Purification, at which Time an Offering should be made for Each One of Them. ORIGINAL RULING of 49 A.D.

... "It seemed good to Us (Whole Church Council of Jerusalem), being Assembled with One Accord, to Send Chosen Men to You (Gentile Church of Antioch On The Orontes) with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, Men Who have risked their lives for the Name of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We (Whole Church Council of Jerusalem) have therefore also Sent Judas and Silas, Who will also Report the Same Things by Word of Mouth. For it seemed Good to the Holy Spirit, and to Us, to lay upon You No Greater Burden (Circumcision) than these Necessary Things: That You (Our Fellow Brothers In Christ) Abstain from: ..."

... "<u>Things Offered to Idols</u>, ¹ from <u>Blood</u>, ^{2a} from <u>Things Strangled</u>, ^{2b} and from <u>Sexual Immorality</u>. ³
If You keep Yourselves from these, You will do well. Farewell!"

CURRENT POSITION of 57 A.D.

A – YES

Paul Was Always Careful Not To Offend Jews Or Gentiles In His Preaching & Teaching of the Gospel Message!

TO JEWS

Paul Writes To The Gentile Believers In Corinth, "What is <u>My Reward</u> then? That when I Preach the Gospel, I may Present the Gospel of Christ without charge, that I may not abuse <u>My Authority</u> in the Gospel. For though I am Free from All Men, I have made <u>Myself a Servant to All</u>, that I might <u>Win</u> the More; and to the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might <u>Win</u> Jews; to those Who are Under the Law, as Under the Law, that I might Win those Who are Under the Law; ..."

TO GENTILES

Paul Continues, ... "To those Who are Without Law, as Without Law (not being without Law toward God, but under Law toward Christ), that I might Win those Who are Without Law; ..."

TO THE WEAK

... Paul Continues, "To the Weak (Those Who Hold Onto Customs & Traditions) I became as Weak, that I might <u>Win</u> the Weak. I have become All Things to All Men, that I might by All Means <u>Save</u> Some. Now this I do for the Gospel's Sake, that I may be <u>Partaker</u> of It (Gospel) with You."
