"What Was The Reason For Jesus' Triumphant Entry Into Jerusalem?" CA1

Jesus' Freed Us From Sin & Death. He Saved, Sanctified, & Set Us Free, By His Triumphant Sacrifice! "Jesus' Triumphant Entry Into Jerusalem!"

Now when they drew near Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of His disciples; and He said to them,1 "Go into the village opposite you, where as you enter you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. And if anyone asks you, 'Why are you loosing it?' you shall say to him, 'Because the Lord has need of it."

So, those who were sent went their way and found it just as He had said to them. But as they were loosing the colt, the owners of it said to them, "Why are you loosing the colt?" And they said, "The Lord has need of him." Then they brought him to Jesus.²

All this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying: "Tell the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your King is coming to you, lowly, and sitting on a donkey, a colt, the foal of a donkey." 3

And they threw their own clothes on the colt, and they set Jesus on him. 4 A great multitude that had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him.⁵ and then they spread their clothes on the road, while others spread their palm branches from the trees on the road. Then those who went before and those who followed cried out, saying:

"Hosanna! 'Blessed is He Who comes in the Name of the Lord, The King of Israel! 7 Hosanna to the Son of David! 8 Blessed is the Kingdom of our father David that comes in the Name of the Lord! 9 "Peace in Heaven and Glory in the Highest!" Hosanna in the Highest!" 11

Therefore, the people, who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of his tomb and raised him from the dead, bore witness. For this reason, the people also met Him, because they heard that He had done this sign.¹² So, the multitudes said, "This is Jesus, the Prophet from Nazareth of Galilee." ¹³

And some of the Pharisees called to Him from the crowd, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples." But He answered and said to them, "I tell you that if these should keep silent, the stones would immediately cry out."

Now as He drew near, He saw the city and wept over it, saying, "If you had known, even you, especially in this your day, the things that make for your peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. For days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment around you, surround you and close you in on every side, and level you, and your children within you, to the ground; and they will not leave in you one stone upon another, because you did not know the time of your visitation." 14 **New King James Combined Version**

Indeed, what have you to do with Me, O Tyre and Sidon, and all the Coasts of Philistia? Will you retaliate against Me? But if you retaliate against Me, Swiftly and speedily I will return your retaliation upon your own head; because you have taken My silver and My gold, And have carried into your temples My prized possessions. Also the People of Judah and the People of Jerusalem You have sold to the Greeks, that you may remove Them far from their borders.

Behold, I will raise Them out of the place to which you have sold Them, and will return your retaliation upon your own head. I will sell your sons and your daughters Into the hand of the people of Judah, and They will sell them to the Sabeans, to a people far off; for the Lord has spoken.

Proclaim this among the nations: 'Prepare for war! Wake up the mighty men, let all the men of war draw near, let them come up. Beat your plowshares into swords and your pruning hooks into spears; let the weak say, I am strong!' Assemble and come, all you nations, and gather together all around. Jesus Will Rescue His People!

Zechariah Records the Lord's Words, "Behold, the Day of the Lord (Last Day) is coming, and your spoil will be divided in your midst. For I will gather all the nations to battle against Jerusalem; the City shall be taken, the houses rifled, and the women ravished. Half of the City shall go into captivity, but the remnant of the people shall not be cut off from the City. Then the Lord will go forth and fight against those nations, as He fights in the Day of Battle. And in that Day (Last Day) His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, which faces Jerusalem on the East. And the Mount of Olives shall be split in two, from east to west, making a very large valley; half of the mountain shall move toward the north and half of it toward the south. Then you shall flee through My Mountain Valley, for the Mountain Valley shall reach to Azal. Yes, you shall flee as you fled from the earthquake In the days of Uzziah King of Judah.

[The Words of Amos, who was among the sheepbreeders of Tekoa, which he saw concerning Israel in the Days of Uzziah King of Judah, and in the Days of Jeroboam the Son of Joash, King of Israel, Two Years before the earthquake. Amos 1:1]

Thus the Lord My God will come, and all the saints with You. It shall come to pass in that Day (Last Day) That there will be no light; the lights will diminish. It shall be One Day Which is known to the Lord neither day nor night. But at evening time it shall happen that it will be light. And in that Day it shall be, that living waters shall flow from Jerusalem, half of them toward the Eastern Sea (Dead) and half of them toward the Western Sea (Mediterranean); in both summer and winter it shall occur.

And the Lord shall be King over all the earth. In that Day it shall be 'The Lord Is One,' and His Name One. All the land shall be turned into a plain from Geba to Rimmon South of Jerusalem. Jerusalem shall be raised up and inhabited in her place from Benjamin's Gate to the place of the First Gate and the Corner Gate, and from the Tower of Hananel to the King's Winepresses. The People shall dwell in it; and no longer shall there be utter destruction, but Jerusalem shall be safely inhabited.

And this shall be the plague with which the Lord will strike all the people who fought against Jerusalem: their flesh shall dissolve while they stand on their feet, their eyes shall dissolve in their sockets, and their tongues shall dissolve in their mouths."
