Part II "The Ministry Of Saul & Barnabas Yield Much Fruit In Antioch!"

Acts 11:25-30

Then Barnabas departed for <u>Tarsus</u> to seek Saul. And when He (Barnabas) had found Him (Saul), He (Barnabas) brought Him (Saul) to <u>Antioch</u>. So it was that for a whole year They (Saul & Barnabas) <u>Assembled</u> with the Church and <u>Taught</u> a "<u>Great Many People</u>". And the Disciples were first called "<u>Christians</u>" in <u>Antioch</u>. And in these days "<u>Prophets</u>" came from <u>Jerusalem</u> to <u>Antioch</u>. Then one of Them (A Prophet), named Agabus, stood up and Showed (Prophesied) by the Holy Spirit that <u>there was going to be a great famine throughout all the world</u>, which also happened in the Days of Claudius Caesar. Then the Disciples (in <u>Antioch</u>), each according to their own ability, determined to send relief to the Brethren (Disciples) dwelling in <u>Judea</u>. This They (Disciples in Antioch) also did, and sent it to the Elders (Church Council in Jerusalem) by the Hands of Barnabas and Saul.

Acts 11:25-30 (NKJV)

Q: "When Did We Last Encounter Saul / Paul In The Book Of Acts?"
A: 9 Years Ago – Late In The Year 37 A.D.

And He (Barnabas) declared to Them (Apostles) how He (Saul) had seen the Lord on the Road (to Damascus), and that He (Lord) Had Spoken (Rhema) to Him (Saul), and how He (Saul) had preached boldly at Damascus in the 'Name of Jesus' [And of Saul's Escape from the City of Damascus with the help of the Disciples/Followers there]. So, Saul was with Them (Disciples/Followers) at Jerusalem, coming in and going out (for 15 days). And he spoke boldly in the 'Name of the Lord Jesus' and disputed against the Hellenists, but they attempted to kill him. When the Brethren (Disciples/Followers) found out, They brought him down to Caesarea and sent him out to Tarsus (Saul's Birthplace/Hometown).

Acts 9:26-30

NOTE

Now We Encounter Paul Again Still Laboring For Jesus Christ In Tarsus 9 Years Later In Late 46 A.D.

Then Barnabas departed for <u>Tarsus</u> to seek Saul. And when He (Barnabas) had found Him (Saul), He (Barnabas) brought Him (Saul) to <u>Antioch</u>.

Acts 11:25-26a

Q: "How Old Is Saul / Paul Now?"

A: 40 Years Old (Born 6 A.D. – Present Day 46 A.D.)

Q: "How Long Has It Been Since Paul's Conversion To Christianity?"
A: 12-13 Years Ago (Reborn 33-34 A.D. – Present Day 46 A.D.)

NOTE

Saul / Paul Will Write 13 # (14 #) Epistles In The New Testament, He Will Also Take 4 # Missionary Journeys, & Be Martyred For The Faith In Just 22 # Years! 46 A.D. – 68 A.D.

Q: "What Two Primary Functions Do Apostles / Elders In The Church Perform To Encourage, Educate, & Equip God's People?"

A1: Regular Assembly & Gathering Together

A2: Mentoring & Teaching

So it was that for a whole year They (Saul & Barnabas) Assembled with the Church and Taught a "Great Many People" ... Acts 11:26b

Q: "What Were Followers Of Jesus Christ As Lord Called Before This Time From 30 A.D. – 46 A.D.?" A: "People of the Way"

Now Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the Disciples of the Lord, went to the High Priest (Caiaphas), and asked for Letters (Warrants Of Authority, Legal Arrest & Extradition) from him to the Synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the "Way", both men and women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem.

Acts 9:1-2

"People of the Way" (x5)

(Acts 19:2, 19:9, 19:23, 24:14 & 24:22)

NOTE – New Simultaneous & Synonymous Names

"People of the Way" - "Christians"

And the Disciples were first called "Christians" in Antioch ... Acts 11:26c "Christians" (x3)

Followers Of Jesus Christ As Lord In The 1st Century AD?"

A - Yes

"Nazarenes" (x1)

Context: Saul / Paul On Trial Before The Governor Felix

For we have found this Man (Paul) a plague, a Creator of Dissension among all the Jews throughout the World, and a Ringleader of the Sect of the "Nazarenes".

- 2) Named After Antiochus IV (Epiphanes) By His Son, Nicator


Famous Maccabean Revolt & War - Miracle & Feast Day Of Hannukah

Now Back To Today's Scripture

Q: "After Jesus Christ Ascended Into Heaven, Were There Prophets In The Church?"
And in these days "Prophets" came from <u>Jerusalem</u> to <u>Antioch</u> ... Acts 11:27

The Designation In English: "Prophet" Is From The Greek Word: "Prophetai", which does not mean "Prophet, Like A Chosen & Anointed Person" From The Old Testament, Or "Prophet" Given In The New Testament To "John The Baptist" Or "Jesus Of Nazareth".

In The New Testament "<u>Prophecy</u>" Means: "To Be Given Divinely The Gift Of Prophecy". Prophecy In This Understanding Means One Gift In A List Of Gifts Given By Divine Will By God's Holy Spirit To Certain Individuals. Thus, These Individuals In The Christian Church Had a Special Gift Of Prophecy, But Are Not <u>True Prophets</u>, As Stated In The Rest Of The Holy Scriptures.

Paul Teaches On The Gift Of Prophecy - Among A List Of Other Gifts In The Church

"And God Has Appointed These in the Church: first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, administrations, varieties of tongues". Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Are all workers of miracles? Do all have gifts of healings? Do all speak with tongues? Do all interpret?"

1st Corinthians 12:28-30 (Also: 14:24-32)

"And He Himself (Jesus Christ) gave some to be apostles, <u>some prophets</u>, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the Equipping of the Saints for the Work of Ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ."

Ephesians 4:11-12

Agabus, Was An Elder In The Church.

Who Had Been Given The Gift Of Prophecy By The Holy Spirit

Then one of Them (A Prophet), named Agabus, stood up and Indicated (Prophesied) by the Holy Spirit that <u>there was going to be a great famine throughout all the world</u>, which also happened in the Days of Claudius Caesar ...

Acts 11:28

NOTE - Agabus' Prophecy Given Early In The Spring Of 47 A.D.

In The Reign Of Claudius Caesar There Were A Series Of Very Poor And Blighted Harvests Over A 7-Year Period From Fall 47 A.D. to Spring 54 A.D.

Church Prophecy Fulfilled

Judea & Jerusalem Faced A Severe Famine Late In The Year 47 A.D.

This Famine Lasted Till Late Into The Year 48 A.D.

NOTE

That Means The Relief Effort Was Actually Being Organized & Sent Just Before It Was Actually Needed Because Of The Prophecy Given By The Holy Spirit's Direction To Agabus!
... Then the Disciples (in Antioch), each according to their own ability, determined to send relief to the Brethren (Disciples) dwelling in Judea. This They (Disciples in Antioch) also did, and sent it to the Elders (Church Council in Jerusalem) by the Hands of Barnabas and Saul. Acts 11:29-30

This Is Paul's 2nd Visit To Jerusalem

1st Visit

10 Years Ago, In The Year 37 A.D.

When Disciples Steal Him Away Aboard Ship To Tarsus – Acts 9:28-30

2nd Visit

Saul Sent With Barnabas To Deliver The Offering For The Jerusalem Church In 47 A. D. Acts 11:30

"Then after <u>fourteen years</u> (<u>since my conversion on the Road to Damascus</u>)

I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, and I also took Titus with me." ... Galatians 2:1
