"Paul's First Organized Opposition Takes Him To Trial!"

When Gallio was Proconsul of Achaia, the (Unbelieving) Jews With One Accord Rose Up Against Paul and brought Him to the Judgment Seat (City Square of Corinth), Saying (Accusing), "This Fellow Persuades Men to Worship God Contrary to the Law (Law of Moses - Torah)." And when Paul was about to open his mouth, Gallio said to the (Unbelieving) Jews, "If <u>It</u> were a <u>Matter of Wrongdoing or Wicked Crimes</u> (According to Roman Law), O Jews, there would be reason why I should bear with You. But if <u>It</u> is a <u>Question of Words and Names</u> and Your Own Law, then Look to <u>It</u> Yourselves; for I do not want to be a 'Judge' of <u>Such Matters</u>." And He (Gallio) drove Them (Unbelieving Jews) from the Judgment Seat. Then all the Greeks took Sosthenes, the Ruler of the Synagogue, and beat Him before the Judgment Seat. But Gallio took no notice of <u>These Things</u>. So, Paul remained a good while (1.5 Years). Acts 18:12-18a (NKJV)

"Why Did The Unbelieving Jews Of The Synagogue Rise Up Against Paul?

They Rose Up Against Paul Because He Had Taken Away The Leader Of Their Synagogue,

The Head Rabbi, Crispus, & Baptized Him As A Believer

With His Whole Household Into The Christian Faith!

And He (Paul) departed from there and entered the House of a certain man named Justus, one who worshiped God, whose House was next door to the Synagogue. Then Crispus, the Ruler of the Synagogue, <u>Believed on the</u> Lord with *All His Household* (Expansion of Aquilla's & Priscilla's Existing Home Church). Acts 18:7-8

By The Great Rhetorical Speaker, "Lucius Julius Gallio", A Roman Senator.

The Ruling

(But Instead) said to the Jews, "If <u>It</u> were a <u>Matter of Wrongdoing or Wicked Crimes</u> (According to Roman Law), O Jews, there would be reason why I should bear with You. Because Gallio Was a Regional Governor - Part of the Proconsul of Rome, Not Just A Local City Official, Therefore, His Ruling Would Become A Precedent, & Have A Profound Effect On The Roman Empire For Many Years (12), Until The Purge of Emperor Nero, Who Had Gallio & Whole Family Killed For Treason! "What Did Gallio The Roman Official Do Next To The Unbelieving Jews, Who Came Against Paul And His Fellow Christians?" He Drove Those Jews From The City Court! And *He* (*Gallio*) drove Them (Unbelieving Jews) from the Judgment Seat ... Acts 18:16 "What Happened Next To The Jews Who Had Brought Charges Against Paul?" The Local Citizens Drove Them Out As Well, Whipping And Beating The New Leader Of The Synagogue, Sosthenes! "Then all the Greeks took Sosthenes, the Ruler of the Synagogue, and beat Him before the Judgment Seat"... Acts 18:17ab Ω "What Did Galileo The Roman Official Do As The Local Citizens Whipped & Beat The Rabbi Sosthenes?" Α He Turned A Blind Eye! "But Gallio took no notice of These Things" ... Acts 18:17c "What Did Paul Do In Response To These Things?" He Remained Obedient To The Lord Jesus Christ, Staying In Corinth Preaching & Teaching The Gospel For A Year And A Half! "So, Paul remained a good while (1.5 Years)!" ... Acts 18:18a CO1"What Can We As The People Of God, Learn From This Morning's Scripture Reading & Teaching?" CA1 That God Is Always Faithful To Us & He Always Keeps His Promises To Us! Now the Lord Spoke to Paul in the Night by a Vision, "Do Not Be Afraid, But Speak, and Do Not Keep Silent; For I AM with You, and no one will attack You to hurt You; for I have Many People in this City." Acts 18:9-10 NOTICE!
