"The New Roman Governor Visits Jerusalem & Makes His Inquiry!"

Acts 25:1-6a

Now Three Days After (Porcius) Festus (Roman Governor) Had Arrived in the Province of Palestine, He went up to Jerusalem from Caesarea (Philippi). And the Chief Priests and the Principal Men of the Jews (Inner Circle of the Sanhedrin Council) Laid Out Their Case Against Paul, and They Urged Him (Festus), asking as a (Personal) Favor Against Paul that He (Governor) Summon Him (Paul) to Jerusalem, Because They (Inner Circle of the Sanhedrin Council & Asian Minor Jews) Were Planning an Ambush to Kill Him (Paul) Along the Way. Festus Replied that Paul Was Being Kept (Under House Arrest) at Caesarea (Philippi) and that He (Governor) Himself intended to go (back) There shortly. He (Festus) Said, "So, Let the Men of Authority Among You (Inner Circle of the Sanhedrin Council) go down with Me, and 'If' There Is Anything Wrong About the Man (Paul), Let Them Bring (Formal) Charges Against Him." After He (Festus) Stayed Among Them not more than Eight or Ten Days, (then) He went down (back) to Caesarea (Philippi).

Paul Underwent A 1st Inquiry / Trial

Before The Sanhedrin Council The Next Day,

In The Roman Fortress With The Roman Garrison Present.

There He Again Was Saved From Death

By The Roman Commander & His Soldiers.

Paul Was Visited & Encouraged By The Resurrected Lord In His Cell. He Was Reminded Of The Prophecies Concerning His Ministry & Death.

Acts 23:11

Paul's Life Was Again Saved By The Unveiling Of A Plot
To Murder Him By The Jewish Authorities By His Nephew.
He Was Taken To Temporary Safety By The Quick Actions
Of The Roman Commander In Jerusalem To Send Him By Night
To Caesarea Philippi & The Roman Governor's Garrison.

Acts 23:12-35

Paul Then Underwent His 2nd Inquiry / Trial Before The Sanhedrin Council.

However, This One Was A Formal Case With <u>Accusations Against</u> Him

Brought Before The Roman Governor, *Antonius Felix*

Acts 24:1-22

Paul Then Was Kept Under House Arrest,

But Afforded Many Privileges Due To His Roman Citizenship.

Paul Is Given an Audience With Felix & His Wife Drusilla,

Where He Again Testifies To The Message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Acts 24:23-26

The Roman Governor Antonius Felix (52-59 A.D.)

Is Replaced After Two Years Of Paul's Imprisonment (57-59 A.D.)

With A New Roman Governor *Porcius Festus* (59-62 A.D.)

Acts 24:27

We Now Find Paul Still Under House Arrest In Caesarea Philippi.

The New Roman Governor, Porcius Festus, Has Gone On A Goodwill Journey To Jerusalem.

This Official Governmental Trip Has Two Goals:

1) To Greet & Legitimize The Jewish Religious Authorities,

2) To Listen To Their Case Against Paul of Tarsus

Now <u>Three Days</u> After (Porcius) Festus (Roman Governor) Had Arrived in the <u>Province of Palestine</u>, He went up to Jerusalem from Caesarea (Philippi). And the <u>Chief Priests</u> and the <u>Principal Men of the Jews (Inner Circle of the Sanhedrin Council) Laid Out Their Case Against Paul. Acts 25:1-2a The Jewish Religious Authorities Recognizing</u>

The New Governor's Legitimizing Of Their Official Rule Over The People

Try To Use *Porcius Festus* As A Political Pawn To Their Advantage

And They Urged Him (Festus), asking as a (*Personal*) Favor Against Paul that He (Governor) Summon Him (Paul) to Jerusalem. Acts 2b-3a

The Real Reason For Their 'Personal Favor'

Was To Provide An Opportunity To Once Again, Murder Paul!

Because They (Inner Circle of the Sanhedrin Council & Asian Minor Jews) Were Planning an Ambush to Kill Him (Paul) Along the Way.

Acts 25:3b

The Roman Governor Offers A Lawful Solution

Festus Replied that Paul <u>Was Being Kept</u> (<u>Under House Arrest</u>) at Caesarea (Philippi) and that He (Governor) Himself intended to go (back) There shortly. He (Festus) Said, "So, Let the <u>Men of Authority Among You</u> (<u>Inner Circle of the Sanhedrin Council</u>) go down with <u>Me</u>, and '<u>If' There Is Anything Wrong About</u> the <u>Man</u> (<u>Paul</u>), Let <u>Them Bring</u> (<u>Formal</u>) Charges Against Him."

Acts 25:4-5

The Roman Governor Returns Home

After He (Festus) Stayed Among Them not more than <u>Eight</u> or <u>Ten Days</u>, (then) He went down (back) to <u>Caesarea</u> (Philippi). Acts 25:6a

Next Week - Preview

The Roman Governor Holds Court

... And the Next Day, Sitting on the Judgment Seat, He (Festus) Commanded Paul To be Brought (Before Him & The Sanhedrin Council Inner Circle).

Acts 25:6b

"Let Us Not Look To Man's Laws & Man's Courts To Guarantee Our Freedoms, Or Our Livelihood On Earth. Let Us Rather Look To God's Holy Spirit To Set Us Truly Free, & To Provide For Our Every Need! As We See More Of Our Earthly Freedoms Erode Away, Let Us Be Alert & Look Up For The Day Of Our Deliverance Draws Closer Than Ever Before! As God Sustained & Allowed Paul To Carry Out His Plan To Preach & Teach The Gospel of His Only Son, Even In Custody Under House Arrest, So He Will Sustain & Allow Each of Us, & Our Church To Carry Out That Same Mission! Let Us Once Again, Here The Admonition & Instruction And Encouragement & Promise Of Our Brother In Faith, Paul To The Church!"
